

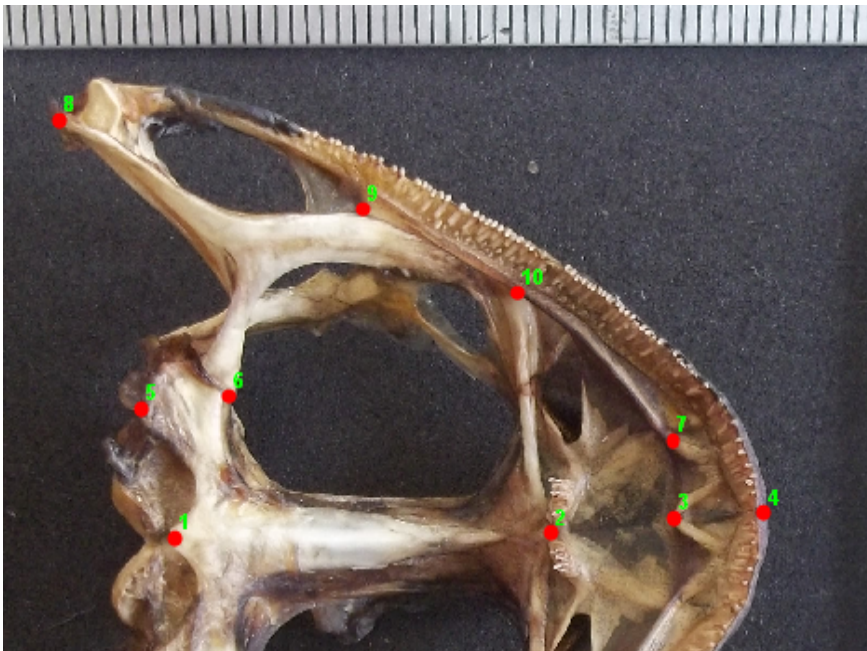

Supplementary figure 1. Landmarck position in ventral view of skull. Ten skulls from frogs of both sexes and localities (n=10), were cleaned with dissecting tools and using commercially bleach for a few minutes to avoid damage. Digital photographs from the ventral aspect of the skull were taken and used to place ten landmarks as suggested for the *Rana* genus by Larson, (Larson, 2002, 2005). Scale bars represent 1 mm.
